

Home Group Discussion Guide for The First Exodus: Our Mighty Redeemer

Exodus 1-12

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The following questions are designed to help groups explore the message shared in the AM service on Sunday. Diving deeper into what was shared, but also challenging participants to consider how God is wanting them to apply it to their lives.

These questions are designed as a guide to help lead discussion. **Please don't feel that all questions need to be asked**, instead respond to the needs of your group.

GETTING STARTED

1. Can you think of a time when someone saw you in trouble and came to help, even if you didn't ask? How did it feel?
2. What was the main challenge or idea that stood out to you from Sunday's message?

REFLECTING ON THE MESSAGE

Key Scriptures: *Exodus 1-12; Specifically, Exodus 1:6-14; 2:23-25; 6:1-7; and 7:8-13*

1. What do you notice about God from reading the passages in Exodus chapter 1 and 2?
 - a. If God is the same today, how do those things relate to us?
2. Looking at the Sign with the staff and the 10 plagues of Egypt (Exodus 7-11) what are some of the examples of God showing He is mightier than the powers of Egypt?
3. What are some examples of God's being mightier than what we face?

RESPONDING TO THE MESSAGE

1. What truth from this message do you need to be reminded of? Why?
 - That God hears us and cares about us? (Even if we don't tell Him ourselves)
 - That God wants freedom for us?
 - That God's power is mightier than what oppresses us?
2. How are you going to ensure that you can hold on to this truth?
