Luke 18:1-8


Luke 18:1-8

¹ Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. ² He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought.³ And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.'

⁴ "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'"

⁶ And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? ⁸ I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

Reality...


We don't always pray

- What is up with the last verse 'but when the son on man comes will he find faith on the earth?'

³ And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.'




What is Jesus communicating to his followers?

Don't Give Up


¹ Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up.

God is NOTHING like the unjust judge



Faith

'Trust in the character of one who can be relied upon.'





Jesus tells us to always pray and not give up because we can trust God's character.

But you, Lord, are a **compassionate** and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.

Psalm 86:15

God heard the boy crying, and the angel of God called to Hagar from heaven and said to her, "What is the matter, Hagar? Do not be afraid; God has heard the boy crying as he lies there.

Genesis 21:17

...neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the **love** of **God** that **is** in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:39

And so we know and rely on the **love God** has for us. **God is love**. Whoever lives in **love** lives in **God**, and **God** in them.

1 John 4:16

And the heavens proclaim his righteousness, for he is a **God of justice**.

Psalm 50:6
