The following questions are designed to help groups explore the message above by challenging participants to consider how God is wanting them to apply it to their lives.

GETTING STARTED

- 1. What is a lesson or piece of advice about forgiveness you have found helpful in life?
- 2. What was the main challenge or idea that stood out to you from the message on Sunday?

REFLECTING ON THE MESSAGE

Key Scripture: Matthew 18:21-35; Colossians 3:13

(Read Colossians 3:13)

1. What is your reaction when you hear Paul's words here in Colossians? Why?

(Read Matthew 18:21-27)

- 2. Jesus tells of a 10,000 talent (or bags of gold) debt. What is the point He is trying to make?
 - a. What kind of debt might this look like today?
 - b. The master chooses to forgive this unimaginable debt What does this teach us about forgiveness?

(Read Matthew 18:27-35)

- 3. How does the servant respond to his debt being forgiven?
- 4. What is Jesus wanting us to understand about forgiveness from these words?
- 5. What does it look like to forgive from the heart?

RESPONDING TO THE MESSAGE

- 1. Is there an area in your life where you need to practice forgiveness?
 - a. What might be the first step for you to engage with that this week?
 - b. How can your group pray for you as you engage with forgiveness?
