The following questions are designed to help groups explore the message above by challenging participants to consider how God is wanting them to apply it to their lives.

*The questions are a **guide** to help lead discussion.*

Please don't feel that all questions need to be asked, instead respond to the needs of your group. If you have new people in your group, take the opportunity to introduce each other and clarify any expectations that are present in your group (such as confidentiality).

GETTING STARTED

1. What are some of the key parts of Alice Springs Baptist Church that drew you to this church in the first place?
2. What is the difference between on mission **every day** and on mission **everyday**?

REFLECTING ON THE MESSAGE

Key Scripture: Acts 3:1-10

1. Do you often look at your life as divided into *sacred* times and *secular* times? i.e. parts that God is interested in, and parts He isn't. Why/Why not?

Consider Acts 3:1-10

2. What are some of the examples/ attitudes of Everyday Mission you see in this passage?
3. Peter and John were going through their ordinary rhythms for the day. What are some of the ordinary rhythms of your day where God has used you in that moment?
4. Consider how Peter and John looked deeply at the person. What does this teach us about our posture for mission?
 - a. What is the difference between trying to increase our availability and increasing our attentiveness to what God is doing?
5. Peter didn't have silver or gold, but he gave what he had. What "silver or gold" do we often wish we had before we feel ready to serve?
6. What does it look like to offer our specific skills or resources "in the name of Jesus"?

RESPONDING TO THE MESSAGE

1. What is God challenging you about the idea of being on mission everyday?
2. What will you shift this week in order to better live out being on mission
